### **STATE & CITY FUNDING UPDATE**

Our hard work paid off. Our perennial champion, Senator Sylvia Allen, once again held steady for funding for our services, and especially for Flagstaff services. We had many other friends at the Capitol, including Senator Karen Fann, Senator Kate Brophy Mcgee, Representatives Walt Blackman, Bob Thorpe, John Allen, and so many others. The result is that we secured a state-wide increase that will help over the coming year, and a significant increase for Flagstaff services, finally!

At the Flagstaff City level, we worked hard to educate the Council about the plight of the DD service providers, due to the Flagstaff minimum wage. Our issue in Flagstaff has been that the State does not believe it should have to fund an initiative created by Flagstaff voters, and the Flagstaff City Council believes that the State is underfunding services overall and that is the real reason for the funding crisis we have been experiencing here.

No matter what you believe, clients are being affected by the lack of funds, and it certainly isn't their fault.

However, the Council appropriated \$150K in their budget process for the current fiscal year, and, thanks to Senator Allen, it will be matched by about \$350K from the federal government (our services are Medicaid services). This \$500K will be distributed to the Flagstaff providers to help with coverage of the minimum wage here. It sounds like a lot of money, but each dollar increase in minimum wage equates to about \$1M in additional cost.

### **MEET HOZHONI HEROES**

Hozhoni would like to recognize the exceptional work of Barbara Manygoats for her many years of service and commitment to the clients of Hozhoni. Barbara, a Direct Support Professional (DSP) at the Hozhoni Foundation for 28 years, was nominated and chosen by the Division of Developmental Disabilities as one of the six statewide recipients for the 2019 Direct Support Professional of the Year Award.

Barbara was recognized at the 16th Annual Direct Support Professional Awards Ceremony on September 27th, and was selected as the overall top DSP of the Year for the entire state of Arizona for 2019. Governor Douglas A. Ducey has proclaimed September 8–14, 2019 as Direct Support Professional week in honor of direct support workers serving and supporting individuals with developmental disabilities.

Barbara has been a valuable and irreplaceable asset to the Hozhoni Foundation. The clients have benefited from Barbara's commitment to cultural heritage and providing them with opportunities to be involved in the community.

In her nomination, it was stated "Barbara has worked in this field for over 25 years. I have known her since she started. During those years I have seen her approach each day as if it's her first. A fresh approach and always a smile on her face. Many of the members she has worked with have no family and many who are Native American have lost touch with their cultural values. Barbara establishes those cultural identities providing opportunities for cultural events such as "Pow Wows", requesting and going on outings to the reservation for the members to visit their homeland or participating in ceremonial events. Barbara has excellent teaching skills, working through the steps of objectives and teaching those not to give up. She has participated in many Special Olympic events throughout the years as a coach, mentor, and a unified participant. She has taught and orientated many staff and has been a valuable asset to the Hozhoni Foundation."
